


TREALES CHURCH GRAVEYARD CHANGES TO THE ASHES AREA

You may recall a notice in the Parish Press last year regarding some changes proposed to the newer area for ashes in the graveyard.

A low wall, one stone high (approximately 25cm), is to be placed in front of the ashes memorial stones. This will mean that the memorial stones can then be placed higher and so will better match the adjacent older area for ashes. It should also reduce the extent to which leaves gather on the graves after windy weather. The existing graves will not be disturbed.

We have now received Diocesan approval for the work which it is anticipated will take place during June. There shouldn't be much disruption in the area but please take care where there are materials stacked and if any work is underway.

LETTER FOR JUNE 2023

Dear All,

I am writing this on a very warm spring day. The birds are nesting, the blossom is beautiful and the sun is shining. Praise be to our Creator God.

We are coming to the end of the Easter Season - the most important season in the Church's calendar which is at the centre of the Christian Gospel.

We have celebrated Christ crucified – His Cross by which every member of the human race can enter into the life of God. St Paul says: 'Christ crucified, the power of God,' as this is the victory over everything that separates us from God and His eternal, faithful Love.

From Easter Day we are celebrating His Resurrection knowing that Christ lives among us.
