


#### Reflection on our half term

It has been a very busy start to the new school year. The children have reflected on their learning and want to share what they have enjoyed.

In Oak class our new Reception children have made a great start to learning. They have enjoyed making friends, singing songs, phonics (they know 12 sounds already!) and listening to stories.

In Year 1, Archie commented 'We've been learning to write numbers in words and how to use a part whole model in maths.'

In Year 2 Ted said 'We have been painting pictures on the computer. I drew a ship. We have also been reading lots of books about toys in the olden days. We read The Teddy Robber and Old Bear.'

In Willow class they have been studying The Iron Man. They looked at rocks and soils in science and the stone age in history. They learned a poem about The Iron Man, adding their own actions and expression and performed it in our Celebration Worship.

This half term in Elder class, year 5 said they have enjoyed learning about typography in art. They have also enjoyed reading the book 'My name is River' which is all about a child who travels to Brazil to save his dad's farm. Year 6 enjoyed the trip to Fairhaven and liked creating artwork on the beach. They also found the fire talk given by local firefighters very informative. Year 6 have also enjoyed their hockey lessons and reading Anne Frank.

Dear All,

We are a very enthusiastic Parish Council looking for a friendly and efficient person to join our team in the role of Parish Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer (RFO). The role is open for an immediate start following interviews and selection by the Parish Council.

The successful applicant will be responsible for all aspects of administration including financial record-keeping and monitoring, advising councillors on policy and procedures, setting the agenda, attending and minuting monthly evening meetings (1st Monday of each month excluding August and December) and management of the Parish Council website.

This is a part-time, home-based position with a basic 6.5 hr week. A laptop can be supplied for business purposes.

## LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF THROUGH TRAFFIC

**MOORSIDE**, Treales from its junction with Cross Lane down to its junction with Kirkham Road will be closed from 9am till 5pm Wednesday 15th November to 17th November to allow carriage resurfacing works by LCC, Highways. The alternative route is via Kirkham Rd-Church Rd-Cross Lane.

You should have received details via post of the proposed plans to bring infrastructure on land (instead of following the coast) to connect the off shore wind farms to the National Grid substation at Penwortham. There is a statutory consultation until 23rd November 2023.

There are several consultations planned throughout the Fylde, the nearest being: Saturday 11th November 10am-1pm at

William Sugar Hodgson Pavilion, Coronation Rd, Kirkham, PR4 2HE.
