

We are all very excited to move forward into Advent and our Festive Season. We have lots of exciting events planned. come and join us. We are also looking forward to carol singing, the Christmas Fair, our tree lighting, a visit to Shrek the Musical, a visit from Blossom the donkey to our outdoor nativity scene and much more!

Oak class are very busy in class as always. In DT the children are absorbed in their project 'design a vehicle for Father Christmas'. The children were given the brief of designing a new vehicle for Father Christmas to deliver the presents on Christmas Eve. Excitement filled the room and the children have worked hard to investigate how vehicles move, looking at wheels and axles. The children have researched what makes a good vehicle and have designed their own vehicle. We are now at the making stage of our process and the vehicles are looking fabulous. Soon we will evaluate and make any modifications needed to make sure the vehicles are ready for Father Christmas to use at the end of December. In our science lessons the children have all investigated materials, looking closely at the different properties of materials and how these each have a purpose when selecting a material to be used for a particular purpose. The children are asking lots of questions and thinking critically about how they can find out their answers, using different types of enquiry.

Our reception children have settled into school fantastically; they are showing they are independent learners and are extremely keen to learn new skills and knowledge. We have loved learning our new sounds and reading words with these in and showing what super writers we are becoming. We love to explore the world around us and are inquisitive learners and ask lots of questions. This half term we have focused on stories and texts all about stars, the children are slowly transforming our classroom one star at a time!

Willow class have enjoyed a visit from Life Education this week and have been learning all about how their body works and how to keep it healthy. The children have been exploring different stories based around fairytales. They have enjoyed reading the Princess Blankets by Carol Ann Duffy and exploring the

beautiful illustrations. The current class novel is 'The Day I Fell into A Fairy Tale' by Ben Miller. These books are building up the children's excitement in preparation for their forthcoming school trip to watch Shrek the Musical. In DT the children are designing and making gift boxes. They have carried out product research and evaluated different types of packaging. They have been exploring 'nets' and how to create them using a computer. The children are looking forward to seeing their designs come to life! In Geography the children have been exploring how and why the local area has changed. They were visited by a former pupil, who shared their experience of Treales School and how the school has changed. The children have then made their predictions about how the area and school may change in the future; we have had some very interesting ideas!

Elder class have enjoyed their visits from James from 'Walk through the Bible'. They have been learning about the New Testament and using actions to help them remember all the books. In science they are learning all about Space and have been thinking about how big space is and comparing the size and distance of planets through different media including clay. Elder class

children continue to learn to play guitar and are practicing Silent Night ready for our school Christmas events. In design technology they are learning about gears and pulleys and are excited to visit to Kirkham Grammar to use their DT workshop to bring their learning to life.

LETTER FOR DECEMBER

Dear Friends,

Although I am writing this letter to you in the middle of November, you will be reading it in December when all the expectant excitement of Christmas will be well under way.

There are two tired old cliches about Christmas which I find very hard to agree with.

Firstly, 'Christmas is really only for the children', and secondly, 'Christmas has been spoiled - it's too commercialised.'

Of course as children, the magic, the mystery and the excitement of Christmas is inextricably linked to Father Christmas with his elves and reindeer, and naturally what presents he might be bringing on Christmas Eve. But as we grow up as Christians, there is the gradual realisation that there is also magic, mystery and excitement in the story of the nativity; the baby born in a stable, the angels, the shepherds and the wise men - the knowledge that that little helpless baby would grow up to be the Saviour of the World.

Oh I know our perception of it all owes more to Victorian Christmas cards and Hollywood blockbusters than to the harsh reality of life in Palestine two thousand years ago, but does that really matter? Surely the important thing is that the nativity story touches our hearts and reaches into even the most cynical of souls. So when it comes to Christmas, we are all children - children of God, a God who loves each one of us so much that He sent His only begotten Son to be our Saviour.

As for commercialisation, 'bring it on' I say. I love the garden centre displays and the way our towns, villages and streets are transformed from gloomy midwinter places to visions of light, joy and delight. I even like most of the Christmas ads on the TV (or at least the first forty times I see them). But, and it's a big but, there is a proviso; the words of Remembrance Sunday are still fresh in my mind as I am writing this, and in particular, 'Lest we forget.' When we are enjoying the self indulgences of Christmas we must never forget that many millions of people will not be warm, safe and well fed this Christmas or have friends and family to share it with. The commercial trappings of Christmas are not bad or anti Christian in their own right but become so only if they seduce us into forgetting our prime responsibility given to us by Jesus when he said 'Love one another as I have loved you.'

So let's do all we can to share God's love with those less fortunate than ourselves this Christmas season and then let the joy and the peace of the Christ child fill our lives and our homes.

A very happy Christmas to you all and may you have a healthy, peaceful and prosperous New Year.

Almost all of the 60,000 plus bulbs have been planted across the parish; thank you very much to the many volunteers who made this possible. These will look beautiful in the Spring.

Last week 3 members of the group attended the Fylde Council Volunteers event at the Town Hall in St Annes. It was nice to hear the stories of the hundreds of volunteers across the Fylde who run projects to help people in need and to enhance the area in which we live. A North West In Bloom representative spoke about how there was a move from formal floral displays to more holistic and sustainable planting schemes that fit with the natural environment and encourage wildlife; he was interested in our "re-wilding" initiative! St Annes have seen an increase in insects and birds in areas of the town where the grass cutting has been reduced and where they have introduced insect loving plants into their displays. We met some interesting people and got lots of advice and new ideas to try going forward.

Thank you to those people already growing seeds for next year but if anyone else could help that would be much appreciated.

Can you spare any Snowdrops and English Bluebells from your own garden next Spring? (These bulbs do much better when planted with their leaves still on after flowering.) If so please contact one of the members below.

Any help and advice and ideas for the future would be very welcome. Please get in touch.

We are working with the Church, School and Fylde Rangers to record species of flora and fauna in both the Church lawn and its flower meadow. This will be an ongoing science project for the children who will record what they see emerging in Spring and what food sources are available in each area and carrying on throughout the year.

Big thanks to Greg Kay for all his help and expertise and congratulations to Treales School who will soon planting lots of new trees in the school grounds and beyond!
